9 Ways to Protect Yourself

1. **Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Attackers tend to target individuals who are not paying attention. Those who are fumbling for their keys or distracted by a cell phone conversation.**
2. **Walk on the opposing side of traffic.**
3. **Walk with confidence. With your head held high. Someone who walks with confidence less likely to be a victim of an assault.**
4. **Don't walk with both of your headphones. Again you are not being aware of your surroundings if you can't hear your surroundings.**
5. **Walk home in areas with good lighting. Choose a main street instead of an alley.**
6. **Remember that 80% of sexual assaults that occur the victim knows the offender. Be wary of those individuals not respecting your boundaries.**
7. **Always look in and around your car before exiting or entering your vehicle.**
8. **Yell FIRE instead of help.**
9. **Avoid high-risk situations where there is a greater risk of assault. For example: Going to the bank at night .**
